

Marlipins Museum ‘Maritime’ press release

‘Maritime’ is an exceptional exhibition drawn from Marlipins Museum’s art collection. Marine paintings and ship portraits dominate the display from good weather to bad. There are tales of ship wrecks, looting and a miraculous escape for a pig and canary. Shoreham’s own rich ship building and ship ownership past is well represented.

Marlipins also claims the title of the oldest secular building in Sussex. It houses three further galleries, the collections include ship models, wreck finds, local history and archaeology.

Marlipins Museum has its own interactive ship with dressing up, music making and story telling.
